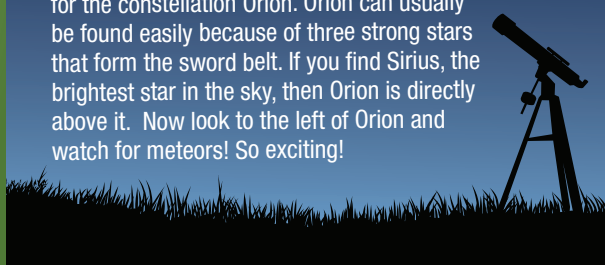

Wake Me When the Shower Starts

You may want to ask your parents for a special middle of the night wake-up call on October 20, 21 or 22! When Earth passes through dust released by Halley's Comet, it sends out a shower of meteors known as the Orionids, and there are up to 20 meteors an hour on those nights! At around 1:00 a.m. with east on your left and southeast on your right, look to the sky for the constellation Orion. Orion can usually be found easily because of three strong stars that form the sword belt. If you find Sirius, the brightest star in the sky, then Orion is directly above it. Now look to the left of Orion and watch for meteors! So exciting!
